TEMPORARY, PART-TIME POSITION AVAILABLE

Thanks to a Progress Program grant from Goshen County Economic Development Corp., LaGrange-Bear Creek Unity Association will be hiring a temporary, part-time summer staff person for the LaGrange Library. The length of this employment will be determined upon hiring and the hours will vary between 20-35 hours per week.
